What is WaterAid?

WaterAid's vision is a world where everyone has access to safe water and sanitation.

Safe water and sanitation are basic human rights. Everyone in the world should have access to them. Yet one in eight people don't have safe water to drink and over two and a half billion live without somewhere safe and clean to go to the toilet.

Without these basic services 4,000 children die needlessly from diarrhoea every day and communities remain trapped in a cycle of poverty and disease.

£15 could provide safe water, sanitation and hygiene education to one person like Bundaa.



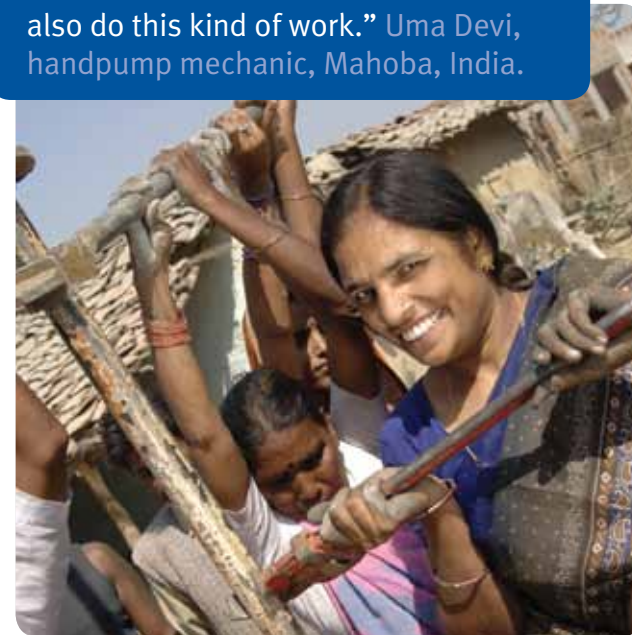
“Before we had the latrine we got diarrhoea or cholera and had to attend hospital for treatment which cost a lot of money.”
