# Together we can change Juliette's story




Join us to make sure families like Juliette's don't have to struggle to survive without clean water.

With the support of groups like yours, families will be able to drink and wash without the fear of getting sick. Children will be able to go to school instead of spending hours each day collecting water.



We are working with local partners to supply over 12,000 people in Manjakandriana with clean drinking water. Our project will collect water from two natural lakes, filter and clean it, then distribute it to families like Juliette's via a 12km pipe network. This sustainable solution will bring life-changing water to nine villages, including nine schools and two health clinics.

Last year, the support of groups like yours helped to bring clean water to Talo Health Centre in Mali. Now 5,000 people like Salimata have a more hygienic place to welcome babies into the world. Newborns are given a safer start in life and everyone can get the vital medical help they need.

## Juliette's village never had clean water

Drinking water collected from a pool teeming with parasites and going to the toilet in the open is the reality for Juliette who lives in the district of Manjakandriana with her family. Having no clean water touches every part of her family's life – their health, their ability to go to school or work – and locks them in a cycle of poverty. That's if they survive at all.

## Clean water changes everything

- Almost half the population don't have access to clean water
- 9 in 10 people don't have a decent toilet
- 4 out of 5 people live in extreme poverty
- Almost 4,000 children under 5 die a year from diarrhoea, caused by dirty water and poor toilets

## Madagascar

Working in partnership with local people, we have already brought clean water to nearby villages in Madagascar.

In Tsarafangitra, hundreds of families now enjoy clean water for washing, drinking and irrigating their crops. The village's school got a brand new toilet block too, so children don't have to miss out on their education. It's the start of a new story for the people of this busy village but there are many more communities in Madagascar we still need to reach.
