



How your church can help deliver clean water to health centres like **Talo in Mali this Christmas**



- The existing borehole nearby will be deepened and reinforced.
- Water will be stored in a 10 cubic metre tank on a raised tower.
- The water will be drawn up with a pump powered by solar energy.
- The storage tanks will be connected to the delivery room and the three consultation rooms.
- The water from the water tower will be chlorinated to ensure there is no contamination, and to protect its quality.
