Sunday School activities

Inspire younger members of your congregation with our fun, easy ideas for Sunday School. Activities are recommended for ages 7+ but can be adapted for other age groups too.



Harvest Appeal 2023

This session will get the group thinking about growing food and the importance of having reliable water.

Begin by explaining that at harvest time, we celebrate and give thanks for food grown on the land.

Open a discussion on the things plants need to grow (good soil, sunshine, water). Now talk about climate change, and how across the world, rain is becoming more unpredictable. In many places, dry seasons are lasting longer. How does this impact people's ability to grow food?

11-year-old Rosine lives in Burkina Faso, a hot, dry country in West Africa, where climate change is making it even more difficult to grow food. Thanks to a reliable supply of water for the school garden, Rosine and her class can now grow food to eat. They have learnt all about growing plants and how to make them thrive. Children at Rosine's school can be healthier. They can also sell excess produce to the local community, so everyone benefits.

This harvest, our church is fundraising for WaterAid's Harvest Appeal. We are helping more communities get reliable clean water so they can grow food and have harvests to celebrate too.

Activity

- Old plastic containers
