

Priority Status for Glastonbury 2022




We're so excited to be back at Worthy Farm in 2021, despite the fact it will look a little different this summer.

As part of Worthy Pastures 2021, we are offering volunteers the chance to gain priority status for our Glastonbury 2022 Team. This is because:

- By volunteering successfully at Worthy Pastures, you'll gain valuable knowledge of the Glastonbury site, as well as experience volunteering with WaterAid at a festival. The training you will complete onsite and online will also give you experience and insight on how WaterAid works at events
- We recognise that one of the main reasons volunteers come to Glastonbury is for the music. Worthy Pastures does not have a programme of live music - although there is lots to enjoy whilst not on a shift, such as great food and drink and a beautifully created campsite!
- Completing all shifts as part of the Worthy Pastures team therefore reflects a strong level of commitment to WaterAid

For these reasons, those who successfully complete their volunteering role at Worthy Pastures 2021 will gain priority status for our Glastonbury 2022 team.

Priority status does not guarantee you a place on our Glastonbury 2022 team but does mean that we will process these applications first when allocating places in 2022. We usually get over 3,000 applications for only roughly 600 volunteer places for Glastonbury, so priority status will significantly improve your chances of getting a place on the 2022 team – for Glastonbury Festival's huge return after two years away!



To gain priority status for Glastonbury 2022, WaterAid Worthy Pastures volunteers must:

- Successfully complete their full volunteering place at WP for at least one 6-day rotation of shifts (totalling 6 shifts), adhering to all the conditions set out in the Volunteer Agreement
- Submit a strong application for Glastonbury 2022 when applications open in January 2022

WaterAid will then honour Worthy Pastures volunteers' priority status by:

- Recording on our systems those who successfully complete their Worthy Pastures volunteering place (therefore gain priority status)
- Upon opening applications to the public in 2022, allowing priority status applicants to note that they volunteered at Worthy Pastures in 2021
- Prioritising those priority status applicants when allocating places, by reviewing and allocating these applicants to our 2022 Glastonbury team first

Please note:

- The above is at the discretion of the WaterAid festivals team. There may be changes to our partnership or to the volunteering roles we have to offer in 2022 and this could impact the allocation of places
- Priority status will not necessarily have any influence on the role you are allocated in 2022 and you will still need to submit a strong application in 2022 and complete any relevant training
